Materials Needed

print needed worksheets, a tent or blankets and chairs, scissors, crayons, pencil, yarn, flashlight, tape or glue, magnet, white pillowcase, iron and ironing board, optional: marshmallows

Welcome Time: Free Play

Language Time

Tent Fun: Set up a tent or make one out of blankets and chairs.

Worksheet: Flashlight Spotlight (have the children wear their flashlight necklaces)

Starlight Spotlight: Have the children sit in a circle, in the tent. Turn on a flashlight and take turns shining the flashlight on each child while saying, "Star light, star bright, first star I see tonight, I wish I may, I wish I might, find the star that shines so bright." Whichever child you end on, have him stand up and help him share what's on his flashlight necklace. Then do the poem again until each child is spotlighted.
