

What Time Is It?

Directions

- Print or glue pieces onto cardstock. Let your child color, then cut out the pieces.
- Attach the arrows to the face of the clock with a brad or poke a pipe cleaner through the clock and hands, then twist the ends into a circle on the front and back.
- Let your child hold the clock and explain that each day is made of hours, minutes and seconds. We do different things morning, afternoon and night. Then let your child turn the clock arms and choose a time. Tell your child which time they chose (morning, afternoon or night) and have them act out what they do at that time.
- Some ideas: brush teeth, get dressed, clean the house, read a book, eat lunch, play with friends, take a nap, drive to the store, eat dinner, or take a bath.
